Manager's Choice

The Poker Manager will determine the buy-in and poker game for the tournament. The selection must be per the games approved in the Poker Policies and Procedures manual.

Bounty Tournaments

Bounty prizes are awarded to each person who eliminates another player during the poker bounty tournament. The prize is \$5 per elimination. Players may win multiple prizes if they eliminate more than one participant.

All bounty prizes must be paid before the end of the tournament.

Definitions

Rebuys - Available for the first 30 minutes of the poker tournament. All rebuy fees are the same as the original buy-in.

Add-ons - Available at the end of the first level. The cost is \$10 for \$1,000 in tournament chips. One add-on per player. The fees are \$5 entry fee + \$3 house fee + \$2 dealer fee.

Tournaments may also have a fixed amount of payout to be predetermined. The prize payout percentages may be adjusted per buy-in, rebuys, or fixed prize variables.

Chopping the pot is permissible upon agreement of all players at the final table.

By participating in any tournament, you agree to abide by the rules and behave in a courteous manner. A violator may be verbally warned, suspended from play for a specified length of time, or disqualified from the tournament. Chips from a disqualified participant will be removed from play.

1. Players will draw for seating positions at the table with an optimum of ten players per table.
2. The appropriate starting amount of chips will be placed on the table for each paid entrant at the beginning of the event, whether the person is present or not. Absent players will be dealt in, and all chips necessary for antes and blinds will be put into the pot.
3. Each hand will consist of a small and big increasing at the Tournament Directors direction.
4. If a paid entrant is absent at the start of an event, at some point an effort will be made to locate and contact the player. If the player requests the chips be left in place until arrival, the request will be honored. If the player is unable to be contacted, the chips may be removed from play at the discretion of the director anytime after a new betting level is begun or a half-hour has elapsed, whichever occurs first.
5. A late player maybe allowed entering up to 15 minutes which is determined by the first bell of the Tournament Director. The player will be required to post the big blind regardless of seating position and will be seated by the Tournament Director.
6. The amount of the small and big blinds will increase every 15 minutes at the Tournament Director's direction and maybe increased every 10 minutes once the final table is reached. (This increases action on the table).
7. If there is a signal designating the end of a betting level, the new limits apply on the next deal. (A deal begins with the first riffle of the shuffle.)
8. The lowest denomination of chip in play will be removed from the table when it is no longer needed in the blind structure. All lower-denomination chips that are of sufficient quantity for a new chip will be changed up directly.
9. An absent player is always dealt a hand, and will be put up for blinds, and the forced bet.
10. A player must be present at the table to stop the action by calling "time."
11. Only breaks allowed are at the discretion of the tournament director.
12. A player must be at the table by the time all players have their complete starting hands in order to have a live hand for that deal. (The dealer has been instructed to kill the hands of all absent players immediately after dealing each player a starting hand.)
13. As players are eliminated, tables are broken in a pre-set order, with players from the broken tables assigned to empty seats at other tables.
14. A change of seat is not allowed after play starts, except as assigned by the director.
15. In button games, if a player is needed to move from a table to balance tables, the player due for the big blind will be automatically selected to move, and will be given the earliest seat due for the big blind if more than one seat is open.
16. New players are dealt in immediately and take over the obligations of that position, including the small blind or button position.
17. The number of players at each table will be kept reasonably balanced by the transfer of a player as needed. With more than six tables, table size will be kept within two players. With six tables or less, table size will be kept within one player. The Tournament

Director will review the tables to see if some players at larger tables are short stacked or all in before making change.

18. In all events, there is a redraw for dealer's button when the field is reduced to three tables, two tables, and one table. (Redrawing at three tables is not mandatory in small tournaments with only four or five starting tables.)
19. A player who declares all in and loses the pot, then discovers that one or more chips were hidden, is not entitled to benefit from this. That player is eliminated from the tournament if the opponent had sufficient chips to cover the hidden ones (A re-buy is okay if allowable by the rules of that event: see # 33 below). If another deal has not yet started, the director may rule the chips belong to the opponent who won that pot, if that obviously would have happened with the chips out in plain view. If the next deal has started, the discovered chips are removed from the tournament.
20. If a player lacks sufficient chips for a blind or a forced bet, the player is entitled to get action on whatever amount of money is left in his stack. A player who posts a short blind and wins does not need to make up the blind.
21. All players must leave their seat immediately after being eliminated from an event.
22. Showing cards from a live hand during the action injures the rights of other players still competing in an event, who wish to see contestants eliminated. A player in a multi-handed pot may not show any cards during a deal. Heads-up, a player may not show any cards unless the event has only two remaining players, or is winner-take-all. If a player deliberately shows a card, the player may be penalized (but his hand will not be ruled dead). Verbally stating one's hand during the play may be penalized.
23. Limit of the bet plus 3 raises per round will be enforced.
24. At no-limit play, the player must either use a verbal statement giving the amount of the raise or put the chips into the pot in a single motion. Otherwise, it is a string bet.
25. Non-tournament chips are not allowed on the table.
26. Higher-denomination chips must be placed where they are easily visible to all other players at the table.
27. All tournament chips must remain visible on the table throughout the event. Chips taken off the table or pocketed will be removed from the event, and a player who is caught doing this may be disqualified.
28. Inappropriate behavior like throwing cards that go off the table may be punished with a penalty such as being dealt out for a length of time. A severe infraction such as abusive or disruptive behavior may be punished by eviction from the tournament.
29. The deck is not changed on request. Decks change when the dealers change, unless there is a damaged card or if 2 colored decks are used.
30. In all tournament games using a dealer button, the starting position of the button is determined by the players drawing for the high card.
31. The dealer button remains in position until the appropriate blinds are taken. Players must post all blinds every round.
32. In heads-up play with two blinds, the small blind is on the button.
33. Re-buys are allowed only if player is knocked out in first 30 minutes of play which is determined by the Tournament Director's timer. The player must have lost all their chips to qualify for a re-buy. The player in the middle of a hand must be all-in before the timer goes off to qualify for a re-buy. The player will be required to post the big blind on a re-buy. If a player announces the intent to re-buy before cards are dealt, that player is playing behind and is obligated to make the re-buy.
34. All hands will be turned face-up whenever a player is all-in and betting action is complete.

35. If two (or more) players go broke during the same hand, the player starting the hand with the larger amount of money finishes in the higher tournament place for prize money and any other award.
36. Management is not required to rule on any private deals, side bets, or redistribution of the prize pool among finalists.
37. Private agreements by remaining players in an event regarding distribution of the prize pool are not condoned. Any private agreement that excludes one or more active competitors is improper by definition.
38. A tournament event is expected to be played until completion. A private agreement that removes all prize money from being at stake in the competition is unethical.
39. Management retains the right to cancel any event, or alter it in a manner fair to the players.
40. If a player is knocked out of the tournament and is due to receive the dealer's button the button will be placed where the player was seated and declared dead for the one hand in order to keep the blinds in the correct order in all other cases the button will move to the next player in line.
41. This is a no limit tournament there is not a maximum bet however there is a minimum bet of the big blind on all bets.
42. Spectators are to remain at least an arms length distance from the back of the players chair at tables in play.
43. Decision of the tournament director is final.
44. The Bad Beat Jackpot or any special promotion prize cannot be won during a tournament.
